# **ADMINISTRATORS' REPORTS**

Reports were presented by the administrators, as follows:

- Scott Stahl, OCHS Principal, thanked Mr. McNerney for his many years of service to the district. He
  welcomed James Street and Ian Proper, our new armed security guards from Gittings Protective Security.
  Mr. Stahl shared that he and Dr. Weller attended the PA School Safety Conference in Pittsburgh on
  September 15. Next week he will be conducting a bollard assessment.
- Sara Haupt, OCHS Assistant Principal, shared that a PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) program has been put in place at the high school. Teachers are onboard and students are excited to earn rewards, particularly Oiler gear. She added that the program is making it more clear which behaviors need targeted.
- Tracy Delmonaco, Director of Special Education, reported we are in Year 3 of taking back the elementary autism program, and currently six students are enrolled in the Smedley classroom. At this time, Mrs. Delmonaco is spending time in the classroom on Tuesdays to coach and model, while the RIU Autism Coach also comes a half day each week. She has also contacted PaTTAN for additional supports.

- Anne Curran, Principal at Smedley and Seventh Street Elementary Schools, reported a great start to the new school year. Fire drills have been conducted, a lockdown drill will be held soon, and field trips to the fire station during Fire Safety Week are planned. Trooper McGee will be coming to visit during Bus Safety Week. Students at both schools are involved in morning announcements. The South Side House program started last week and a Home and School Family Night was held as well. Upcoming events are the Smedley Literacy Night on September 28 and the Seventh Street Literacy Night on October 20.
- Lisa Shuffstall, Supervisor of Pupil Interventions, reported that IEP meetings are being held to refine behavior plans and supports to ensure student success. Another book study for teachers will begin soon. The High School Emotional Support class will be participating in the Venango County Youth Retreat at Camp Coffman on September 27.
- Craig Kasunic, Co-Principal at Oil City Middle School, reported a marked improvement in attendance over the same period of time last year. He also shared that a new policy this year requires cell phones to remain in lockers during the school day. Not only have teachers appreciated fewer disruptions and distractions, but students have also reacted positively, noting there is now much less drama during the school day and it's a nice break from their technology- and social media-filled lives.
- Joy Zuck, Co-Principal at Oil City Middle School, reported that the first HEIGHTS Family Night was held on September 8. The families enjoyed dinner and built an escape room. The WEB program remains strong, with thirty-four eighth grade WEB leaders this year. In addition to the half-day orientation for sixth grade students, a homecoming tailgate event was held prior to the middle school football game with Franklin. Joy expressed her appreciate to the WEB advisors for their continued dedication to the program.
- Matt Siembida, Principal at Hasson Heights Elementary School, reported that painting is completed at Hasson. Some remaining projects, including countertop installations, are caught in supply chain delays. Beginning of the year benchmarking is completed, and our Reading and Math Specialists are starting to work with identified students. In addition, fire drills have been conducted, as well as a multitude of IEP meetings.
- Amy Highfield, Assistant Principal at Hasson Heights Elementary School, reported that no kindergarten orientation was held this year due to the construction project. An Open House for all students was held on September 9, with a good turnout. The School Wide Positive Behavior Plan is in full swing, and behavior expectations are being highlighted a week at a time. The focus this week is expected behaviors on the bus.
