ADMINISTRATORS' REPORTS

Mrs. Sara Haupt, Assistant Principal at Oil City Senior High School, reported that the annual Team Building Day was held on October 6. The day began on the football field with an activity coordinated by Bridges for Justice. The rest of the day was spent in various activities at Two-Mile Run, including canoeing, kayaking, fishing, hiking, games and more. Mrs. Haupt also reported that the fall sports season is coming to an end, and senior nights have been held in all sports to recognize seniors for their athletic and academic achievements, as well as to let them share special memories of their time devoted to high school sports.

Mr. Scott Stahl, Principal at Oil City Senior High School, reported that on October 11, students from our American Political Process class participated in the Oil Heritage Energy and Security Conference, which was held at Drake Well. Students took part in panel discussions regarding fossil fuels and continued to build our relationship with Ambassador Ibrahim of Azerbaijan. The students presented the Ambassador with an #Oilers Together t-shirt. Mr. Stahl also shared that active shooter drills are scheduled for November. Teachers will be reminded to review options available in every situation using the A.L.I.C.E. protocol. On October 25, National Honor Society will induct new members. The ceremony will take place at 6:00 p.m. in the cafeteria.

Mrs. Tracy Delmonaco Special Education Director, reported that the number of homeless or unaccompanied youth has risen to almost three percent. Students in the Life Skills class will be traveling to the Oil City YMCA once again this year, and they are also developing a partnership with a local nursing home so students can explore career options. At this time, Mrs. Delmonaco noted there are no active Title IX cases.

Mrs. Amy Highfield, Assistant Principal at Hasson Heights Elementary School, noted that 148 coats were distributed to Hasson students as part of the Oil City Fire Department's annual Coats for Kids campaign. During Fire Prevention Week, several classes visited the fire station, while others received a visit from the firefighters. Mrs. Highfield reported a good turn-out for "Bring your Parent to PE Week." During Red Ribbon Week, students will meet with Trooper McGee, participate with Paws for a Cause (Keep our Paws Off Drugs), and enjoy Trunk or Treat.

Mr. Matt Siembida, Principal at Hasson Heights Elementary School, reported that students collected over 400 boxes of tissues during the recent tissue drive, with Team Amistad winning the competition. Jim "Basketball" Jones visited Hasson recently and inspired the students with his presentation. Approximately 70 students from Hasson participate in the Backpack Buddy program, and all students are enjoying the new Fresh Fruits and Vegetables program this year.

Mrs. Anne Curran, Principal at Smedley and Seventh Street Elementary Schools, reported it has been a busy month on the South Side. Schools held literacy nights, observed Fire Safety Week with field trips and visits with firefighters, and enjoyed Donuts with Dads. Grade 4 students attended a performance of "Matilda" at the Barrow Civic Theatre. Chief Ragon spoke with students about bus safety and Annie Welsh from the Oil Region Library Association brought books for students to read and return. She will come each month with a new selection of books for the students to enjoy. Trooper McGee will participate in Red Ribbon Week events. Students are working on their parts for the Veterans' Day pre-parade program in Justus Park.

Mrs. Joy Zuck, Co-Principal at Oil City Middle School, shared that the monthly HEIGHTS Family Night involved Paws for a Cause and ice cream treats. She shared a list of participating local businesses who will give treats to students wearing their Red Ribbon Week bracelets and asked that we support these businesses. On November 12, the Middle School will hold a dance, complete with costumes, as a fund-raiser for the Washington, DC field trip in June.

Mr. Craig Kasunic, Co-Principal at Oil City Middle School, noted that 35 employees are participating in the Fittest Winner challenge this year. Through a partnership with SMILES Mobile Dentist program, 41 students were seen by a dentist last week, with 23 receiving sealants and 4 receiving emergency dental care.
